



"CAN YOU TELL I'M A CHRISTIAN?"

A good way to emphasize what God expects of us is to draw a large figure of a child on pastel-colored poster board. Print this title above it: "Can You Tell I'm a Christian?" Let the children think of some things from the Bible that God tells us to do and write these on the drawings. Here are some aspects of

Christian conduct, which should be included:

- Do good deeds (Galatians 6:10)
- Be truthful (Ephesians 4:25)
- Be kind (Ephesians 4:32)
- Love your enemies (Matthew 5:44)
- Be patient (I Timothy 6:11)
- Be a witness (Acts 1:8)
- Be obedient to authority (Romans 13:1, Ephesians 6:1)
- Be a peacemaker (Romans 12:18)
- Forgive one another (Ephesians 4:32)
- Go to church (Hebrews 10:25)

You will think of other things to add to this list, but even these ten principles could be a good place to begin. Remind them that Christ not only died for us, but also He lives in us to help us do those things, which please Him. He even gives us the "want to" to do them!
