

ORTHODOX CHRISTIAN GOALS & OBJECTIVES

for
Grades Preschool – High School

The original purpose of this undertaking was to determine what an Orthodox child needs to know at each grade level in the areas of Church History, Doctrine, Ethics, Feasts, Hymns, Liturgy, Missions, Mysteries/Sacraments & Other Services of the Orthodox Church, Prayers, Saints, Scripture, Service, Spirituality, Tradition, and Worship. To this end a survey was conducted among the Clergy and Church School Directors of the Detroit Diocese. Fr. James Bogdan, DRE for the Detroit Diocese, integrated the survey responses. Bishop Nicholas of Detroit requested input.

Meanwhile, Annunciation Church [Akron, OH] sought to evaluate the parish’s curriculum, which is predominately from the Greek Archdiocese coupled with some OCEC materials, because the teachers of the High School class had repeatedly observed gaps in the knowledge of their students. What are the true reasons for these gaps?

- ❖ Are there gaps of knowledge built into the curriculum?
- ❖ Did the students’ irregular attendance lead to the gaps of knowledge?
- ❖ Are the teachers teaching the curriculum?

The first step was to determine what is in the curriculum. It should be noted that at various stages the work was taken to Annunciation’s Curriculum Committee for commentary and input. (Additional members of the Curriculum Committee: Fr. Jerry Hall, Fr. Michael Monos, Church School Director Elaine Poulos, Dr. Georgette Constantinou, Dr. Connie Gerassimakis, Presbytera Helene Hall, Dr. Jeanette Moleski-Criswell.)

For Preschool through Grade 6, Nick Gerassimakis, Ph.D. and Phyllis Meshel Onest, M.Div. (1) examined each page of each textbook and teacher’s guide of the Greek Archdiocese curriculum, (2) integrated those findings with the Detroit Survey results, and (3) cross-referenced the combined information with the “Living Our Orthodox Faith: Scope & Sequence.” *For grades 7-12*, the Detroit Survey results and the results of several brainstorming sessions were cross-referenced against the Scope & Sequence. Available Resources for grades 7-12 are listed with the topic. The Unit and Lesson Numbers and/or page numbers listed within brackets note items that are actually in the curriculum. If more than one book is used, the code for each is listed at the beginning.

The information has also been rearranged by the following topics: Feastdays, Hymns, Prayers, Mysteries/Sacraments & Other Services, Saints, and Scripture. This was done so that, at a glance, one can see (1) in which grade an item is introduced, (2) if a particular item actually appears in the curriculum and (3) how often an item is discussed over the years.

The Curriculum Committee now needs to review the following report to determine (1) what topics need to be added, (2) when they should be added, reviewed, or expanded and (3) list resources for the topics to be presented in Grades 7 & 8 and Grades 9-12.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. When planning the order of lessons, try to do them in the order they appear in the Liturgical Calendar. This includes Bible stories, Feast Days, Seasons.
2. Do the section on "God's House" nearer to the beginning of the year in order to teach good Church Etiquette from the beginning. The way GLU is laid out there are at least 12 weeks before getting to "God's House" which is too long.
3. Do the lessons on the seasons as they occur rather than as a unit. This will also reinforce the theme of Creation several times during the year.
4. Review vocabulary and Church Etiquette each week in order to reinforce these points.
5. Utilize the Parents' Letters from RFJ or similar letters to keep the parents informed of what is happening in class.
6. Utilize the OCEC's "Teaching Pictures."
7. Utilize the "Come Bless the Lord" Icon Packet.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

1. When planning the order of lessons, wherever it is possible, do them in the order they appear in the Liturgical Calendar. This includes Bible stories, Feast Days, Seasons.
2. The Creation lessons are short. Consider coupling these lessons with church etiquette [II-1] and items found in the church.
3. Review vocabulary and Church Etiquette each week in order to reinforce these points.
4. Utilize the Parents' Letters from both texts or similar letters to keep the parents informed of what is happening in class.
5. Since there are no lives of saints in the two texts, there is a need for supplemental material.
6. When teaching the feast days, read from a child's Bible and focus on what is happening in the icons and who is present.
7. There is a need to make the connection that Jesus is God's Son.
8. Emphasize that we are Orthodox Christians. Orthodox Christians worship God during the Divine Liturgy, which is our form of worship. When we are baptized, we become Christians and members of the Orthodox Church.
9. Since the children may be bringing a variety of projects home, the only ones that need to be kept are those that have been blessed.
10. Utilize the OCEC's "Teaching Pictures."
11. Utilize the "Come Bless the Lord" Icon Packet.

3. The Activity Book contains activities that are trivial. Suggest that other activities be devised.
4. On page 7 of the pupil's textbook it states that "He [Jesus] also learned by helping His father Joseph." It should read "His *earthly / step* father." This could be confusing to the children.
5. In comparison to the other books in this series, the grade 1 textbook needs the most supplemental material. If time permits, tell more about the lives of the saints that are included in the Bible readings.

GRADES 9-12 GOALS & OBJECTIVES

Many parishes combine 9th through 12th grade classes into a High School Class. This may be done, in part, because of the number of available students. Another reason for this grouping is that by now they have completed eight years of catechetical training and the emphasis should shift to a practical application of the faith in one's life and the significance of the faith in the world. This does not mean that there will no longer be didactic presentations. The vastness of Orthodox theology and Tradition requires us to present additional material to the high school student as needed

For this to happen, a high school program needs to:

1. Introduce our students to the issues and situations of the world.
2. Identify the unique Orthodox characteristics (monasticism, theology, worship, and role in the world, social issues).
3. Brings together the totality of Tradition that entails Scriptural ability and the skill of finding Patristic commentaries [Integrate Scripture, Church Fathers, Doctrine, Hymns, Icons, Church Services].
4. Present the Orthodox teaching and maintain the Orthodox Ethos.

High schoolers should:

1. Take an active participatory role in the liturgical year, becoming knowledgeable of its details and conversant with such events as the Triodion, the Pentecostarion and the balance of the ecclesiastical cycle. They could sing in the choir, be readers, and be actively a part of the charitable activities (collect, deliver things, etc.), and assume a stewardship role in the life of the parish.
2. Know and understand the unique Orthodox aspects of a religious life.
3. Be able to apply the teachings of the faith to everyday life and situations (drugs, sex, abortion, creation, worship, etc.).
4. Know the meanings of the words listed on the Vocabulary List.

*The following 6 Units for discussion can be rotated over the course of four years, and even returned to for another level of understanding. **Comparative Religions, Eschatology, Marriage & Family Life, Modern Ethical Issues, Service & Mission, Spiritual Life.***
