Welcome back to another Church School year! This issue of the Pittsburgh Diocese's *Religious Education Newsletter* contains a short review of the Summer Institute and of new resources, plus the listing of the Fall Religious Education Workshops and a number of enclosures. The "Yellow Pages" for *Religious Education* has grown to 23 pages. I have again included several lesson plans for the high school class, plus information and samples of *Talksheets* that I have found useful. Brochures from IOCC and Project Mexico are included to assist you in the ongoing development of outreach and mission programs for our students and parishes. To assist Directors and Teachers at the beginning of the year, there are student information and parent volunteer sheets which were originally done by Adam Chongris, former Church School Director of SS. Constantine & Helen Cathedral, Cleveland, Ohio. I hope to see you at one of the workshops and wish each of you a blessed year in your ministry as Catechists!

1999 Archdiocese Summer Institute of Religious Education was held from July 29 – August 1 at Hellenic College/Holy Cross School of Theology. Fr. Anthony Coniaris' keynote address on Thursday evening, "Sacred Tradition: A Treasure Trove for Religious Education," set the tone for the next two full days of worship, speakers, and sharing. Fifteen speakers offered 24 presentations in keeping with the theme of Holy Tradition. This year's "Institute format" offered the 125 plus participants a choice of two presenters for each of the six daily sessions, plus three single presentations on Friday evening. Each presentation was videotaped and will be available for purchase from the Department.

Topics ranged from "The Gospels: A Crash Course" to "Cloning and Orthodox Anthropology" to "What Our Hymns Can Teach Us" to "Seeing is Believing: Exploring Icons." I am especially excited about the CD-ROM presenta-

tion offered by program developer Bradley Borch. "The Royal Road," which centers on the Tridion period, includes music and icons and much, much more as it takes us from the 'Publican and the Pharisee' to Pascha! It should be available for purchase before Christmas.

Three parishes of our Diocese sent participants. Each parish needs to budget funds to send at least one teacher to the Summer Institute, which will be held at Holy Cross on alternate years from the Archdiocese Clergy-Laity Congress. The cost includes the registration fee (\$175), which includes dormitory accommodations and meals, plus travel expenses (\$210-\$250 if you're flying from the western region).

Oratorical Festival 2000 Topics and Topic Tips are found in the **1999-2000 Annual Resource Companion (ARC)** published by the Department of Religious Education. This year's theme is "Holy Tradition." Cost: \$5.00.

Orthodox Family Life has a new editor. After four years of editing *Orthodox Family Life* I have turned over the editing and production to Niki Toda Krause, co-founder and technical editor. New Materials for the High School Class are Coming! – Fr. Frank Marangos, Archdiocese

DRE, announced that the Department has received a \$170,000 grant to develop materials for this age group. This was the most important need identified in the climate survey conducted two years ago.

“Sharing Corner” – Many ideas were shared at this year’s Summer Institute of Religious Education. We have individuals [a] developing their own Preschool/ Kindergarten curriculum, [b] coordinating and providing the resource materials for the High School Class taught weekly by various adults of the parish, [c] making vestments for 20” high dolls, [d] decoupage icons on flat rocks that become Prayer Rocks, and more. Other ideas are shared at workshops and parish visits. The goal of this section is to examine, edit (if needed), enhance, and reformat those ideas and projects, then distribute them throughout the Diocese. Submissions are welcome. This issue includes the Student and Volunteer Information sheets submitted by Adam Chongris, Chardon, Ohio, a lesson plan for teaching Holy Tradition by Paul Seiben of Holy Trinity, Toledo, Ohio, Fr. Irinej Dobrijevic’s “IOCC Children’s Lenten Project.”
