DEAR PARISH FAMILY,

When I was younger, my parents would often use the phrase, "don't do that, it will become a habit." Some habits, such as over eating or staying up too late, can be bad for our health and safety, so we have to be mindful of not letting them form. However, other habits such as regular exercise or healthy eating can benefit us greatly.

Whether good or bad, a new habit takes time and repetition. Motivational speakers often cite studies explaining that this process takes 21 days. In the month of August, the Church offers us an opportunity to form new habits, or strengthen existing ones, concerning our prayer life and service attendance.

In the first 15 days of the month, we will gather at the Church almost daily to pray the Paraklesis Service. We will ask the Mother of God for Her intercessions, both for ourselves and our loved ones. This is in addition to the celebration of the Feast of the Transfiguration of our Lord, and our usual Sunday worship!

If we were to attend each of these 15 services, we would be two-thirds of the way to a new or strengthened habit of daily prayer. Attending half would put us one-third of the way there. With so many unhealthy temptations in the world, why not take this opportunity to make prayer a new or stronger habit?

This month, let's commit as a family in Christ to prioritize prayer and attendance. Let's build a habit together that our parents wouldn't want us to stop! A schedule of these services is included in the Current, as well as a form to submit the names of friends and family in need of prayer. Please mark your calendars, and Come to Church!



YOUTH CORNER WITH EMMANUEL SALEM

This month we celebrate the death of the Virgin Mary. Someone who lived a life so holy, even the event of her death radiated with God's love.

But what does that mean- that Mary was holy? Most of us make the mistake of thinking that she was just another one of those really "churchy" people, a member of that small percentage of the human race that lived long ago, and were naturally nice. Who loved God more than all of us.

How often do we neglect to stop and see how wrong that is? How often do we fail to see that holiness can seep into every moment of our lives, could fill us up, could even fill up those around us? That holiness is accessible to all of us, that we are called to become today's saints? How often do we neglect that holiness that Mary had simply because we fail to look for it?


But if holiness is in the here and now, what does that imply for us today? What does it mean to become a saint, to be holy like Mary? What does it mean for our church of Annunciation? For the people we encounter in our day to day? What does it mean for those people right outside the doors of our church? What does it mean for our city, the people of Akron?

For one, it means we have no excuse. We can't say we're dirty or impure without hope. Being like Mary isn't outside or beyond us, and the minute we tap into God and His love, we are a little closer to being like her, to being what we are meant to be. We are called to abide in and share that holiness.

For another, when we ponder that human beings can connect to God, human potential is infinitely unlocked. That a human being can bear the God of the universe- can become holy- flips the whole of our understanding human existence on its head. But that is a topic for our fireside discussions this month, which you should come to.
